Join us for an optional day trip to an exciting nearby town or attraction. It's a perfect chance to see new sights, learn more about England, and enjoy a fun day out!

Saturday trip key information:

- Age: 12-17 years old
- Activity time: 09:00 to 17:00 on Saturdays
- **Minimum student number:** 8 (We are unable to provide the programme if the student number is less than 8; please check with our office before booking.)
- Meeting point: Ealing broadway station at 09:00
- Price per week: £100 per week (including a guided tour and return train tickets)

Programme details:

Kingston - Discover Kingston, where seven Saxon kings were crowned. Start with a scenic walk through Bushy Park, famous for its wildlife and views of King Henry VIII's palace grounds. Then, enjoy lunch and free time at the historical Kingston market with options like museums, shopping, and riverside walks.

Brighton - Explore Brighton, once a royal seaside retreat. After a guided tour of its historic buildings, enjoy free time in the vibrant Lanes, play games on Palace Pier, or capture the unique coastal views and street art.

Greenwich - Sail to Greenwich, birthplace of iconic royals like Henry VIII. Take a guided walk through the Queen's House, admire the Great Hall, and browse the market for snacks and souvenirs. Enjoy free-time options with views of the Univer-sity of Greenwich and East London

Oxford - Step into the history of Oxford, home to the oldest English-speaking university. See iconic university sites and stroll the peaceful meadows. Back in the city centre, enjoy free time for lunch, museums, galleries, or shopping.

Windsor - Visit Windsor, home to the famous castle. Enjoy a historical walking tour, a riverside stroll, and free time for shopping in the quaint town centre or exploring the Long Walk. (Note: Castle entry is not included.)

Cambridge - Explore Cambridge, home to legendary scientists and scholars. Visit university landmarks, learn about famous alumni like Newton and Darwin, and enjoy riverside views. Free time includes museums, galleries, and shopping.

Football English (Wednesday)

After a one-hour lesson, students will take part in a football-related activity, which may be playing a supervised football match, or attending a stadium tour of a London-based professional football club.


Please note: If there are more than 10 students for the week, we will arrange a football game for students. However, if the number is below 10, we will organise a stadium tour.

Junior Business Skills (Thursday)

Our Junior Business Skills programme, built specifically for teenagers, brings together the skills needed to succeed in the world of work and develop day-to-day communication skills. In the workshop they will learn about:

- The working world
- CV and resume writing
- Cover letters
- Job interviews
- Networking skills
- Using technology and social media safely
- Speaking with confidence
- Working with technology and AI





Social Programme: Workshops

For the following workshops, students will have to join for the whole week:

Drama Workshop (between 14th July and 25th July)

Drama is particularly valuable for presentation skills and expression in English encourages teamwork and cooperation. Our drama workshops are led by an experienced theatre director.

At the end of each week, there will be a performance, giving a chance for students to show what they have learnt to their peers. In the workshop, they will also:

- Practise pronunciation
- Improve self-confidence as well as communication and presentation skills
- Prepare to deliver a performance at the end of the week

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineer, and Maths) (between 4th August and 29th August)

Our STEM courses give your children the opportunity to learn crucial STEM knowledge and develop the skills needed in secondary education, all while having fun in an inclusive and interactive classroom environment. Students will:

- Speak about and share ideas on Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM)
- Practise mathematical skills and logic reasoning
- Enquire scientifically, developing their skills in questioning and critical thinking
- Experiment safely to prove or disprove their hypotheses
- Put their knowledge and skills to the test by creating and building within the context of what they've learnt.
